Find this story in your Bible: Matthew 25. 31– end.

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Start with a discussion:

- What is a 'parable'?

The story

This week we hear Jesus using a 'parable' or a story, to explain being a Christian to His followers.

In this parable, Jesus uses the example of a shepherd separating his flock into sheep and goats. Jesus is using this example to show that there are people who will live good lives and believe in God. These people will have a place in Heaven. There are other people who have not followed God and will not be granted a place in Heaven.

He is also telling us to be good Christians by treating others as we expect to be treated ourselves. This teaching is important as it reminds us that we need to think about how others may feel and to think how we would like to be treated if we were in their position.

This week's activity is designed to share with others, either by gifting it, or by simply hanging in our window for others to enjoy.



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Activity: Monoprint sharing hearts

You will need:

- **White paper**
- **Paint (single colour)**
- **Flat headed paintbrush or small paint roller**
- **Pencil**



Roll out a small rectangle of paint onto a clean flat surface. Please make sure your paint will not transfer pigment onto the surface you are using. You can use a tray or the lid of a plastic storage container, it just needs to be flat, free from lumps and bumps!



Place a sheet of plain paper on the top and draw your heart outline direct onto the back of the paper and decorate the centre of the heart with a pattern.

Try your best not to press on the paper.



Peel off your paper and leave to dry.

Repeat this process so that you have lots of monoprints.



Cut out the prints and either make hanging decorations, cards or simply send to others.
