UPDATED 17 MARCH 2020

Following updated guidance from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, public worship is suspended until further notice.

In these turbulent times we recognise people, now more than ever, need space for solace, prayer and quiet reflection. For this reason Durham Cathedral remains open.

We're taking extra precautions to ensure the wellbeing of those who come, including observing best hygiene practices of those who visit.

We are continuing to develop digital resources to help people take part in cathedral worship from home.

There is signage placed around the church, based on official NHS guidance on how best to protect yourself during this period of heightened awareness. We have taken steps to increase the frequency with which we clean regularly touched surfaces in the cathedral.

We are responding in line with national guidance from Public Health England, the World Health Organisation and the Church of England, and will continue to do so as the situation develops.
